The nomination for officers of IBEW Local Union 723 will be held on the following dates and locations in the Month of **April** 2017:

Anyone desiring to be nominated must be present during the nominations or provide a written and signed statement that they will accept the nomination. No member may be a candidate for more than one office; if nominated for more than one office the nominee will have to choose which office they will be a candidate.

Nomination will proceed in the order of offices as listed in the IBEW Constitution; term of office will be three years. The order and offices are as follows:

1. President
2. Vice President
3. Recording Secretary
4. Treasurer
5. Business Manager/ Financial Secretary

6. Executive Board – one per Unit 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5

Additionally, nominations will be held for delegates for the following:

1. Telephone Coordinating Councils (TCC) 3 and 4
2. System Council T7 (SCT7)

In reference to the TCC and SCT7 the Business Manager shall, by virtue of the respective office, serve as a delegate leaving 1 (one) at-large delegate position each. No member nominated for the office of Business Manager may be nominated for the at-large delegate positions.

In order to be nominated, a member must have a minimum of 2 (two) years of continuous good standing in Local Union 723. Good standing means that the member is current in the payment of dues and has been for the 2 (two) years preceding the nomination.

The election shall be conducted by mail ballot, and ballots shall be counted beginning at 9:00 A.M. on June 17, 2017. Ballots received after the close of business on June 16, 2017, will not be counted. Instructions on the use of the mail ballot will be enclosed with the ballot.

Candidates shall be entitled to an observer during the counting of the ballots. Observers may not interfere with the orderly procedure of the election.

In the event a runoff election is required, same shall be held on July 15, 2017. The same rules shall apply to the runoff election as were applicable to the regular election.

All officers shall be installed and begin their three (3) year terms at the regular meeting of the local union on July 7, 2017.

Any member who believes a protest of the election is warranted during the conduct of the election is urged to contact the Election Judge. Further protests of the election may be filed in writing with International Vice President of the 6th District within thirty (30) days following the election. The decision of the International Vice President shall conclude the processing of a protest within the IBEW. In the event the protesting member is not satisfied with the decision of the International Vice President; the member may submit his/her protest to the U.S. Department of Labor.
